- 6. During the business session portion of this Remote Public Meeting the audio of all members of the public attending the meeting will be muted. At the end of the business session of the meeting, a time for public comment will be available. Members of the public who desire to provide comment shall raise their virtual hand in the Zoom application and/or submit a written comment via the text message section of the application. The meeting moderator will queue the members of the public that wish to provide comment and the Chairperson will recognize them in order. Public comment shall be concise and to the point and shall not contain abusive, defamatory, or obscene language.

AUDITOR AND ACTUARY YEAR-END REPORTS

A draft of the Fund Year 2020 Audit, performed by our new auditor, Mercadian, is attached. The Finance Committee will be reviewing prior to the meeting and will send a final upon receipt. A representative from Mercadien will be in attendance to present their findings. Should there be any comments, PERMA will be prepared to answer. Resolution 19-21 approving and authorization to file with the state is included in the consent agenda, along with the affidavit to be signed by all present Commissioners.

REQUESTS FOR PROPOSALS

Under the Local Public Contracts law, the following positions need to go out for RFP for a one-year term starting January 1, 2022: Actuary, Auditor, Attorney, Treasurer. The following positions need to go out for RFP for a three-year term starting January 1, 2022: Executive Director and Program Manager.

MOTION: Motion to issue and advertise Requests for Proposals for professional services contracts on behalf of the Fund for Executive Director and Program Manager (and Actuary, Auditor, Attorney, Treasurer).

PBM RFP UPDATE

The PBM RFP is underway. Responses were received from 6 companies: Express Scripts, Aetna, AHA, Magellan, Ingenio Rx and OptumRx. Our Pharmacy Benefits Consultant is currently reviewing the financials. The MRHIF Contracts Committee will review and we expect to have a recommendation by the June MRHIF meeting.

FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE STATEMENTS

As is done on the local level and required by State law, each Fund Commissioner is required to complete a Financial Disclosure Statement through the Department of Community Affairs. The 2021 notice with instructions has been released. To date there are 5 Commissioners that have not filed and they have been notified to complete.

COVID Vaccine Administrative Fee Change - Effective March 15, 2021, Medicare updated the Fee for Service payment rate for administration of COVID-19 vaccines to \$40 per injection. The Fund plans have been updated to align with the new payment rate. Prior to March 15th the rates for vaccine administration were:

- \$16.94 for first dose
- \$28.39 for the second dose (for vaccines requiring 2 doses)
- \$28.39 for single dose vaccine.

AETNA UPDATES

Network Negotiation Deborah Heart and Lung - As previously reported, Aetna has been in negotiations with Deborah Heart and Lung. Aetna advised that a new three-year contract was successfully negotiated beginning on May 1, 2021. These facilities remain in-network.

EXPRESS-SCRIPTS UPDATE

National Preferred Formulary Update (NPF) - ESI announced their NPF update for July 1, 2021. Seventy additional products will be added to the exclusion list (included with your agenda). Seventeen Fund members were identified as having filled scripts for one or more of these products in the past year. Impacted members will receive notification from ESI that includes therapeutically equivalent alternatives and are encouraged to discuss them with their physician.

BENEFIT EXPRESS (BE) UPDATE

Benefit Express-WEX Acquisition – A leading financial technology service provider, WEX, recently announced that it is acquiring Benefit-Express. BE is a preferred partner of Conner Strong and provides the benefit administration system utilized by the HIFs. The two companies have worked together for many years and we do not anticipate any changes in our day-to-day operations or system functionality. We have been advised that the BE team will continue as is and, are confident that the services provided by BE including Benefit Administration, COBRA, Direct-billing, will continue with no interruption.

COBRA Subsidy Compliance (American Rescue Plan) – PERMA has identified members who had their health benefits terminated during the National COVID-19 Health Emergency. Employees who were involuntarily terminated, due to a lay-off or reduction in hours may be eligible for a COBRA premium subsidy. As required by the American Rescue Plan, notices concerning the availability of the subsidies from 4/1/2021 through 9/30/2021, will be mailed to these members. Going forward, a new field will be added to Benefit Express to track members who involuntarily lose their health benefits through 9/30/2021.

ADMINISTRATIVE AUTHORIZATIONS

There are no appeal ratifications to report at this time.

WHEREAS, failure to comply with the promulgations of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey may subject the Fund Commissioners to the penalty provisions of R.S. 52:27BB-52 - to wit:

R.S. 52:27BB-52 - "A local officer or member of a local governing body who, after a date fixed for compliance, fails or refuses to obey an order of the director (Director of Local Government Services), under the provisions of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, may be fined not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both, in addition shall forfeit his office."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Executive Committee hereby states that they have complied with the promulgation of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey, dated July 30, 1968, and does hereby submit a certified copy of this resolution and the required affidavit to said Board to show evidence of said compliance.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Executive Director Koval said she received an email from one of the Commissioners with a few questions regarding the Agenda, which she will address as she goes through.

FINANCIAL FAST TRACK as of January 31, 2021– Executive Director Koval said this was a higher than normal month. She said there was about \$500,000 in high claimants, and there was about \$710,000 spent just on Covid claims. She said Aetna will dig into this further.

MUNICIPAL REINSURANCE HEALTH INSURANCE FUND – Executive Director Koval said the MRHIF met on February 10 to reorganize and take action on the following items:

- 1. Awarded a contract to ELMC to facilitate the PBM RFP process, perform 18 month market checks and the annual audits of the PBM contract. She said the other services will be tabled for the future.
- 2. Approved a release of an RFP for the PBM contract.
- 3. Approved a release of an RFP for the Medicare Advantage/EGWP policies. Further discussion will be brought to the local Funds in the next few months.

4. The State Wide contracts committee will be engaged in the above mentioned RFPs. Current committee is below. More Commissioners are welcome to join (no more than 3 per Fund):

5. The Aetna Audit has been completed and will provide the report to each of the Funds in the next month.

PLUMSTED MUA - Executive Director Koval said Plumsted MUA has two benefit eligible employees, which is difficult to obtain reasonable pricing outside of the State. Although its own entity, the MUA has requested to be considered part of the Plumsted Township CJHIF for rates, enrollment and renewal. Pending authorization from the HIF, the Township may consider including these additional lives with their existing plans and rates. The MUA will be considered its own member and will need to sign a separate Indemnity and Trust Agreement. Resolution 17-21 recognizes this new member.

HIGHLANDS BOE - Executive Director Koval said Highlands BOE has sent official notification to terminate from the Fund for medical, but remaining in the Fund for dental. This will take place on May 1, 2021.

MEL/MR-HIF/ CEL EDUCATIONAL SEMINAR – Executive Director Koval said the 2021 seminar will be held virtually on the mornings of Friday, May 14th and Friday, May 21^{st.}. The agenda includes two ethics courses, and presentations on implicit bias, insurance market conditions, proposals to change the Workers' Compensation law and a discussion of proposed changes to the Affordable Care Act.

AMERIHEALTH (AHA) CONTRACT - Executive Director Koval said the AHA contract with the CJHIF has been updated with the most current public sector language requirements and to reflect more terms that are standard for AHA. The compensation amounts are unchanged. This new contract will cover the period from 1/1/2019 to 12/31/2021.

Program Manager Visconti reviewed the Covid flyer that was distributed.

COVID-19 Vaccination Benchmarking – Program Manager Visconti said, The results of a recent Employer Benchmarking Survey regarding employee vaccination policies/concerns was conducted by the Society for Human Resources Management (SHRM) were distributed via email with the CJHIF

Executive Committee, Member-Entities and Brokers. Many companies are encouraging their employees to get the vaccine, but are not planning to require workers vaccinations before returning to work. There is strong divide among employees who believe that any worker eligible for the vaccine should be required to get it and employees who reported that they will NOT get vaccinated even if their employment will be terminated.

Key points from the survey include:

- ✓ 60 percent of organizations say they will not require the vaccinations
- ✓ 60% of workers will probably or definitely get the vaccine
- ✓ 24% of employees not planning to get vaccinated would change their minds if their employer offered incentives cash bonuses or stipends, paid time off (PTO) or gift cards
- ✓ 12% of employees would be willing to get vaccinated only if they would lose their job
- ✓ 77% of government, public administration or military organizations were more likely to encourage employees to get vaccine

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

American Rescue Plan COBRA Subsidies – Program Manager Visconti said the US House of Representatives recently passed a sweeping COVID relief package, which includes a provision regarding subsides for COBRA premiums. If the Senate passes the bill, individuals eligible for COBRA due to involuntary employment termination or reduction in hours may receive an 85% reduction of COBRA premiums.

Key provisions include:

- Subsidies to become available to impacted workers beginning on the first of the month following enactment date and remain available through 9/30/2021.
- Extends COBRA election period to allow workers who previously had a Qualified Life Event (QLE) to enroll in coverage.
- Requires employers to provide clear, understandable, written notices to workers.
- Establishes expedited review process for workers denied premium assistance.
- Provides a payroll tax credit to reimburse employers and plans for the full cost of COBRA premiums not paid by workers.
